Reminder...

Be sure to Register your dog(s) for 2017! The fee is \$2.00 per dog and you must provide a current Rabies vaccination record unless we have a current one on file. All dogs within the Alma City limits **MUST** be registered whether an indoor or outdoor dog to avoid a fine.

Plumbers License is \$25.00

Merchants License is \$7.00

Also, remember that we do have a Leash Law! You cannot allow your dog(s) to run at large in town. You must keep them confined to your yard and when you are walking them they **MUST** be on a leash. We are receiving complaints again that owners are not abiding by this law. Offenders will be warned by a Police Officer if caught in violation and continued offenses can result in a citation. Please be respectful of the other citizens in town.

Election Time!

Reminder that anyone interested in running for Alderman Ward 1 & 2 and Mayor must file at City Hall by January 17, 2017 at 12:30p.m. Alderman Ward 1 (North side of the tracks) will have a vacant seat as Roberta Nienhueser is not renewing her term. Candidate filing is for the April 4, 2017 General Municipal Election. If you have any questions, please contact City Hall.

Also, if you have recently moved to Alma or even moved from the North or South side of town (which changes what Ward you live in), you can fill out a Voter Registration Card at City Hall so that you don't have to make a special trip to the County Clerk's office. Be sure to get this done by March 8, 2017 to ensure you are able to vote in April.

With Winter weather making an early appearance this year, I just wanted to remind everyone that if we do have any measurable snow coming up that requires plows to get out, the gentlemen do appreciate it if you would pull your cars into your driveway or move your vehicles to one side of the street until a pass has been made and then you can move them to the other side so that they can make a pass as close to the curb or edge of the street as possible and to avoid having your vehicle plowed in with snow!
